Skin, Hair, and Nail Collection for Culture

Instructions

- Your doctor has given you a form for this test. This form is called your requisition.
- You will be given a kit to collect a sample(s).
- Use only the collection kit given to you by your doctor, local lab, or blood collection clinic.
- Keep the sample(s) at room temperature.
- Bring the sample(s) to an approved drop-off site as soon as you finish the collection (see back cover for sites).
- Samples that are not labelled correctly or do not have a complete requisition form will not be tested.
- Clean the affected area with alcohol wipes (70% alcohol) and let it air dry.

- Collect the sample on the heavy paper from the kit. See next section for the type of sample you're collecting.
- Refold the paper so that the sample cannot fall out. Do not use tape.
- Place the heavy paper in the envelope provided.
- 5. Seal the envelope and label it with your name, health card number, and date(s) and time(s) of collection.

Skin

- Scrape the edge of the rash using a scalpel blade.
- Collect the skin flakes on the heavy paper. Collect as many pieces as possible.

Hair

- Use tweezers to pluck hair from the affected area. Put it on the heavy paper.
- Scrape the skin around the hair using a scalpel blade.
 Add the the skin flakes to the heavy paper.

Nails

- Use a scalpel blade to scrape away the top layer of the nail. Throw these pieces away.
- Collect the next layer of the nail on the heavy paper. Do not collect a whole nail.

Each requisition must have:

- Your full name and date of birth
- > Your health card number
- Your doctor's full name and address
- The names of all antibiotics you are taking
- The names of all countries outside of North America that you have visited (or emigrated from) in the past 12 months
- Date and time of collection
