## Care After Your Plastic Surgery Procedure

- After hand surgery, keep your hand raised up above your heart for 24 to 48 hours (1 to 2 days). This will help to lower pain and swelling. Move your fingers often.
- You may have some pain when the freezing wears off. Taking acetaminophen (Tylenol<sup>®</sup>) or ibuprofen (Advil<sup>®</sup>) may help. Follow the instructions on the package.

## Caring for your incision (cut)

## If you have a dressing:

- Keep it on and dry for \_\_\_\_\_ days.
- You can then take it off and wash the area gently with soap and running water each day. Do not scrub the area. Pat the area dry. Do not rub.
- Put Polysporin<sup>®</sup> ointment (not cream) or Vaseline<sup>®</sup> on your sutures (stitches) 1 to 2 times a day. You do not need a prescription.
  - Clean away the old ointment before applying new ointment.
- Cover the area with a bandage.

### If you have Steri-Strips™:

- Keep the area dry for 24 hours (1 day).
- After 24 hours, it is OK to let the area get wet.
  Pat it dry. **Do not** rub.
- Leave the Steri-Strips<sup>™</sup> on until they fall off on their own, or for <u>days</u>.

## After your sutures are taken out:

• Massage your scar with moisturizing cream a few times a day for 14 days (2 weeks). This will help to soften and flatten the scar tissue.

## Problems

### If you see bleeding through the dressing:

- Use your hand to keep firm, constant pressure on the dressing for 10 to 15 minutes. Do this 2 to 3 times if needed. This should stop the bleeding.
- If the incision is red, swollen, and tender, it may be infected.

#### If you think your incision may be infected or you have another urgent problem, follow these steps until you get help:
