Palliative Care Volunteers

Volunteers are on Unit 7A every day at the following times:

- > 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- > 6 to 8 p.m.

They offer companionship and help as needed.

 For example, you can ask them to read to you, get you a cup of tea, or get you an extra blanket.

Therapy Dog Volunteers

Therapy dogs visit the unit at different times during the week. The visit times may change. Tell a member of your health care team if you would like a therapy dog to visit you.

Palliative Care Photography Volunteer

You can have a skilled photography volunteer take photos of you with your loved ones or support persons on the hospital grounds. Tell a member of your health care team if you are interested in this service.

Palliative Care Legacy Volunteer

You can have a personal story documented as a keepsake, or to share with your loved ones. Tell a member of your health care team if you are interested in this service.

Palliative Care Hairstylist

You can have a skilled hairstylist cut and/or style your hair. Tell a member of your health care team if you are interested in this service.

Palliative Care Grief Resource Volunteers

These volunteers call people who are grieving to provide information about resources and support available through Palliative Care.

Cookie Time

Volunteers make cookies in the 7A kitchen during the week to deliver to patients and their support persons.

Breakfast Club

Volunteers make homemade waffles in the 7A kitchen 2 times a month. If you are interested, ask a member of your health care team for more information.
