

Criminal Record Check Guidelines for New Hires

To be employed with Nova Scotia Health all new hires are required to provide a satisfactory Criminal Record Check (CRC) during Onboarding. A valid CRC will be accepted within 6 months of the issue date only from one of the providers listed below.

You are required to provide the Criminal Record Check at your own expense, if fingerprinting is required there will be an additional charge you will be responsible for as well.

Patient Contact Requires CRC + Vulnerable Sector Search (VSS)

- You will receive a letter from Recruitment Services if you are being hired into a position that requires both a CRC + VSS
- You will present the letter to RCMP upon your request for a CRC + VSS
- Select 'YES' for the Vulnerable Sector Search option
- Select 'Enhanced Police Information Check'

Non-Patient Contact Requires CRC Only

- Select 'NO' to Vulnerable Sector Search.
- Select Enhanced Police Information Check
