

Do you have cancer? Do you know someone who has cancer? A Community Cancer Patient Navigator May Be Able to Help

Community Cancer Patient Navigators (CPNs) are oncology nurses who work with cancer patients and their families. CPNs are available to support you at all stages of your cancer experience from pre- diagnosis, diagnosis and treatment through to end of treatment, survivorship and if you are living with advanced cancer.

It is important to know that CPNs do not provide medical care.

How can CPNs help?

Each cancer patient has different needs and will deal with cancer in different ways.

CPNs can help you:

- understand your cancer diagnosis and treatment
- prepare you to make decisions about your treatments
- help you manage symptoms and side effects
- provide emotional support and help you and your family cope with your cancer
- · connect with other health professionals within the cancer care program and in your community
- connect with support groups and other resources both in your community and virtually
- enroll in assistance programs (Travel, Financial)
