

You have been prescribed a steroid ointment called ______

This medication helps to lower inflammation (redness, swelling, pain) caused by a skin condition on your vulva called:

This ointment is safe to apply to (put on) your vulva if it has been prescribed to you for this condition. It is very important to put this ointment on **exactly as your health care provider tells you** (see highlighted area of picture above). Be careful where you apply the ointment. Putting it on the wrong area can irritate other skin areas or have other side effects.

Tips to remember:

- 1. Wash your hands just before applying the ointment, and again after you are done.
- 2. Use only a small, pea-sized or half pea-sized amount of the ointment.
