- Have you or a loved one been diagnosed with diabetes (type 1 or 2) or gestational diabetes?
- Do you have questions or concerns about:
 - your diabetes?
 - high or low blood sugar?
 - diabetes medication or other medications?

If you answered **YES** to any of these questions, you may find it helpful to visit a Diabetes Centre.

Who will I see at the Diabetes Centre?

- You will see certified diabetes educators including a Registered Nurse (RN) and a Registered Dietitian.
- You are welcome to bring a support person, such as a family member or friend, to each appointment.

How do I get an appointment?

- Call the location of your choice (see back page for phone number), or
- Ask your family health care provider (doctor or nurse practitioner) for a referral, or
- Ask a member of your health care team (e.g., nurse, pharmacist, dietitian).

What can staff at the Centre help with?

- One-on-one assessment of your diabetes status
- Starting insulin for outpatients
- Checking your risk of foot problems
- Referrals to other programs and services
- Individual and/or group education on diabetes management, including:
 - > nutrition
 - > self-care
 - review of diabetes-related blood work
 - active living and exercise
 - healthy lifestyle
 - medication (e.g., diabetes pills, insulin)
 - blood glucose self-monitoring
 - blood pressure management and monitoring
 - insulin dose adjustment

Is there a cost?

 There is no cost to you. Bring your Nova Scotia (MSI) health card to each visit.
