Each **requisition** must have:

- > Your full name and date of birth
- > Your health card number
- > Your doctor's full name and address
- Collection date and time for each urine sample





Urine Collection for Chlamydia

Instructions

- Use only the collection bottle and tube given to you by your doctor, local lab, or blood collection clinic.
- You will be given a:
 - > bottle (pink top)
 - tube (yellow top)
 - plastic pipette (small tube to draw up fluid)
- Do not collect a sample if you are menstruating (having your period).
- Do not clean your genitals before collecting your urine (pee).
- Do not urinate (pee) for at least 1 hour before collecting your urine.
- Wash your hands before urinating.

If you have problems collecting a sample, call the technologist or lab assistant.

- 1. Take the caps off the provided bottle and tube. Do not touch inside the caps or the bottle or tube. If you touch the liquid in the tube, immediately rinse the area with lots of water and tell your primary health care provider.
- 2. Make sure your skin does not touch the bottle as you pee.
- 3. Collect the first part of the urine (10-50 ml) in the pink-top bottle. Do not collect more than 50 ml, as this will affect the results.
- 4. Immediately transfer the urine into the yellow-top tube using the pipette. Add urine to between the 2 black lines on the tube labelled **Urine Fill Line**.
- 5. Put the cap of the tube on tight. Be sure not to touch inside the cap or the tube.
- 6. Turn the tube upside down 5 times to mix the sample.

- 7. Thow away the bottle and the pipette.
- 8. Wash your hands.
- 9. Bring your sample to an approved drop-off site as soon as you finish the collection (see back cover for more information). If this will take more than 1 hour, put the sample in the fridge until you can drop it off.

Make sure the collection tube is labelled with your name, date of birth, health card number, and date and time of collection.

Samples that are not labelled correctly or do not have a complete requisition will not be tested.
