Diabetes Centres

What is a Diabetes Centre?

- If you or your loved one has been diagnosed with diabetes (type 1 or 2) or gestational (during pregnancy) diabetes, we can help you learn about:
 - › High or low blood sugar
 - › Blood glucose monitoring systems or sensors
 - › Healthy eating
 - › Diabetes medications
 - › Insulin pumps
 - › Diabetes foot care
- We offer 1-on-1 and group education on managing your diabetes, including:
 - › Checking your blood work
 - › Self-care
 - › Healthy lifestyle
 - › Active living and exercise
 - › Medications (like pills, insulin, and injected diabetes medications)
 - › Changing your insulin dose (amount)
 - › Blood pressure management and monitoring

- **We can also:**

- › assess your diabetes status.
- › help you start taking insulin (if you are an outpatient).
- › check your risk of foot problems.
- › refer you to other programs and services.

Who will I see at the Diabetes Centre?

- You will see a certified diabetes educator. This may be a Registered Nurse (RN) or a Registered Dietitian (RD).
- You are welcome to bring a support person to each appointment.

Do I need a referral?

- You can refer yourself by calling to book an appointment (see pages 3 and 4 for phone numbers).
- You can also ask your primary health care provider (family doctor or nurse practitioner) or another member of your health care team (like a nurse, a pharmacist, a dietitian) to refer you.

Is there a cost?

- There is no cost. Bring your Nova Scotia (MSI) health card to each visit.
