<b>Brief description of the Unit</b>	Community based service that provides an array of supports and opportunities for individuals that contribute to their recovery and re-integration back into their community. <b>Unit Orientation</b>	Orientation varies from staff to staff. It includes the Central Zone Mental Health and Addictions Staff Orientation offered by the Clinical Nurse Educators. In terms of service specific orientation, the Addiction and Mental Health Program Orientation Guidelines are followed and a more detailed site specific orientation is offered. Length of orientation will vary according to the mental health experience of the RN. Opportunities for staff shadowing and mentorship are available.
