Service	Psychiatric Emergency Service (PES) is a consultation service. We serve individuals requiring an emergency psychiatric assessment referred from the physicians within the emergency department.	
Site	Located within the QE2 Emergency Department at the Halifax Infirmary Building.	
Brief description of the Unit	The service conducts emergency psychiatric assessments through the completion of a comprehensive assessment and mental status exam.	
Unit Orientation	All nurses require a minimum of two years psychiatric clinical experience prior to working at PES. Nurses new to this unit are given six orientation shifts with ongoing mentorship. Additional orientation is provided if required. All nurses new to the Mental Health Program receive a classroom mental health orientation.

The RN uses a wide range of psychiatric nursing interventions to promote problem resolution. The RN is required to be skilled in nursing assessments, de-escalation of agitation and aggression and intervention of acute crisis. Effective communication and collaboration skills are critically important to delivering safe and effective care. The RN supports the development of students and colleagues by acting as a **Additional Responsibilities** preceptor and providing ongoing mentorship. The nurse collaborates with other disciplines while providing comprehensive nursing care as well as participates in quality improvement initiatives.
