- Personal or family/caregiver experience (within last 12 months) with any NSHA healthcare service in the Pictou, Colchester, or Cumberland counties
- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Can look at issues from more than one point of view.
- Can share honest points of view in a respectful way.
- Be reflective of diverse populations and perspectives in our community.
- Interested in making a positive contribution to health care services.
- Previous volunteer experience is an asset.

Additional requirements:

- Sign a confidentiality agreement.
- Have or be willing to obtain a Criminal Background Check.
- Declare any potential conflicts of interest.
- Be able to commit to attend at least six (6) meetings annually. Meetings are typically held during daytime hours in hospital sites throughout NSHA.
- Be able to commit to a term of two (2) years.

Please note: These are volunteer positions. Current NSHA employees, Community Health Board members and elected officials are not eligible to apply.
