Zoon's Vulvitis

What is Zoon's vulvitis?

- Zoon's vulvitis is inflammation (redness) of the vulva. The vulva covers the opening to the vagina.
- Zoon's vulvitis causes red, shiny patches of skin on the vulva. It is usually found on the introitus (opening of the vulva).
- Zoon's vulvitis is not common.

What are the symptoms?

- Irritation
 Itching
- > Burning > Pain
 - Pain during sex

› Pain

What causes Zoon's vulvitis?

- There is no known cause.
- It is not cancer or an infection.
- It is not contagious.
- It cannot be spread through sexual contact.

How do I know if I have it?

• Your specialist will check your vulva. They may take a biopsy (a small tissue sample). They will send the sample to the lab to be tested.

What is the treatment?

 Your specialist may prescribe a topical (on the skin) medication. Carefully follow all of the directions your specialist gives you. You may need treatment again if your symptoms come back.

Is there any follow-up?

- Follow-up is important to:
 - > make sure that the treatment is working.
 - watch for other conditions that could make Zoon's vulvitis worse.
- Your specialist will tell you when you need to come back to the Clinic.
