Your collection sample will not be tested if:

- it is not labelled correctly.
- your requisition is not filled out.



Instructions

- For at least 48 hours (2 days)
 before your collection, do
 not have sex or masturbate.
 Ejaculating (releasing semen)
 before your collection may
 lower the sperm count and
 volume (amount).
- Do not use a condom to collect your sample. The lab cannot test semen from a condom because there is powder on the inside of the condom.
- Use only the collection bottle given to you by your primary health care provider (family doctor or nurse practitioner), local lab, or blood collection clinic.

Each **requisition** and bottle label must have:

- Your full name and date of birth
- Your health card number
- Your primary health care provider's full name
- Date and time of collection

 Use a pen that will not smudge to print on the collection bottle.
 If lab staff cannot read what you wrote on the bottle label, your collection will not be tested.

Drop off your filled bottle and requisition within 30 minutes (half an hour) after collection. Lab staff may not accept samples received more than 30 minutes after collection.

- Your primary health care provider has given you a form for this test. This form is called a requisition.
- Masturbating is the best way to collect a sample.
- If you cannot collect a sample near the lab, you will need to protect the collection from heat and cold while bringing it to the lab.
- Keep the bottle close to your body to keep the collection at body temperature (armpit).
