- The Clubhouse offers people the chance to:
 - › Connect with others in a safe, inclusive, accepting, non-clinical space
 - › Socialize and learn
 - › Be themselves
- The Clubhouse has drinks and snacks. **It is important to tell a member of the Clubhouse team if you have any food allergies or other medical concerns.**

- People who come to the Clubhouse choose what they would like to learn about, like:
 - › Meal planning
 - › Shopping on a budget
 - › Cooking
 - › Coping skills
 - › Recovery
 - › Self-esteem and self-worth

 - › Healthy relationships
 - › Health and wellness
- Tell us what you would like to learn about. As a group, we will make a calendar together and plan when we will talk about each topic.

Who can attend the Clubhouse?

- To attend the Clubhouse, you must be:
 - › Receiving mental health and addictions treatment services in the Tri-County area (Shelburne, Argyle, Yarmouth, Clare and Digby Counties, or Bear River and Acadia First Nations communities)
 - › Going to regular appointments with your clinician or psychiatrist
 - › Referred by your psychologist, clinical therapist, or psychiatrist

- Tell us if you would like someone to meet you outside or at the building entrance.
