

NOVA SCOTIANS ON THE NEED A FAMILY PRACTICE REGISTRY

As of September 1, 2026

As of September 1, there are 52,771 Nova Scotians on the Need a Family Practice Registry.

The last published number was on August 1, when there were 54,582 Nova Scotians on the registry.

By the end of August, the number of Nova Scotians on the registry decreased by 1,811. This number reflects the cumulative result of activity on the registry since its creation, including registrations, attachments to family doctor or nurse practitioner, and other updates to registration status over time.

The percentage of the population on the registry is 4.8%. Nova Scotia Health will next update the registry in early September.

ABOUT THE RESULTS

The Need a Family Practice Registry (NFPR) numbers show a snapshot of what the registry looked like at the exact time the data was collected. The “active” total includes all the activity that has happened on the registry since it started in 2016.

Because people can sign up, get connected to a family doctor or nurse practitioner, cancel their request, sign up again, or change their details, the numbers won’t always add up between categories, locations, or reporting periods, since individuals may appear in more than one category within the same month. Each number should be looked at on its own. Any breakdowns shown elsewhere, such as by zone or network, are simply different ways of looking at the group of people who were active on the registry at the time the data was collected.

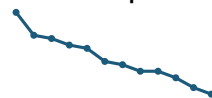

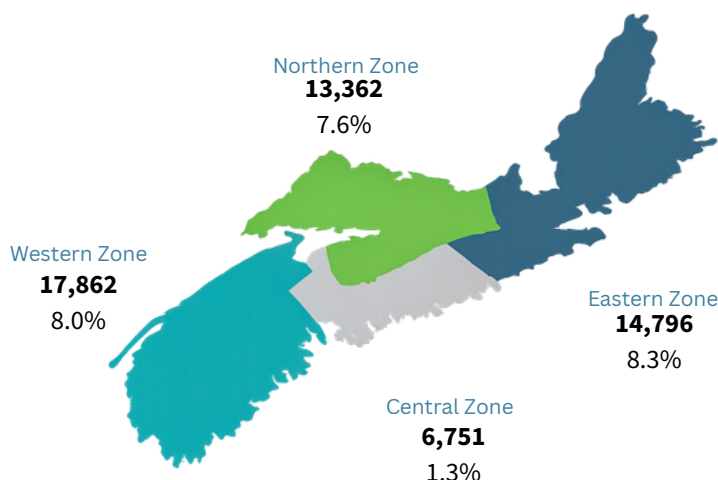

Total volumes and percent of the Active population by Zone, and Network^[1]



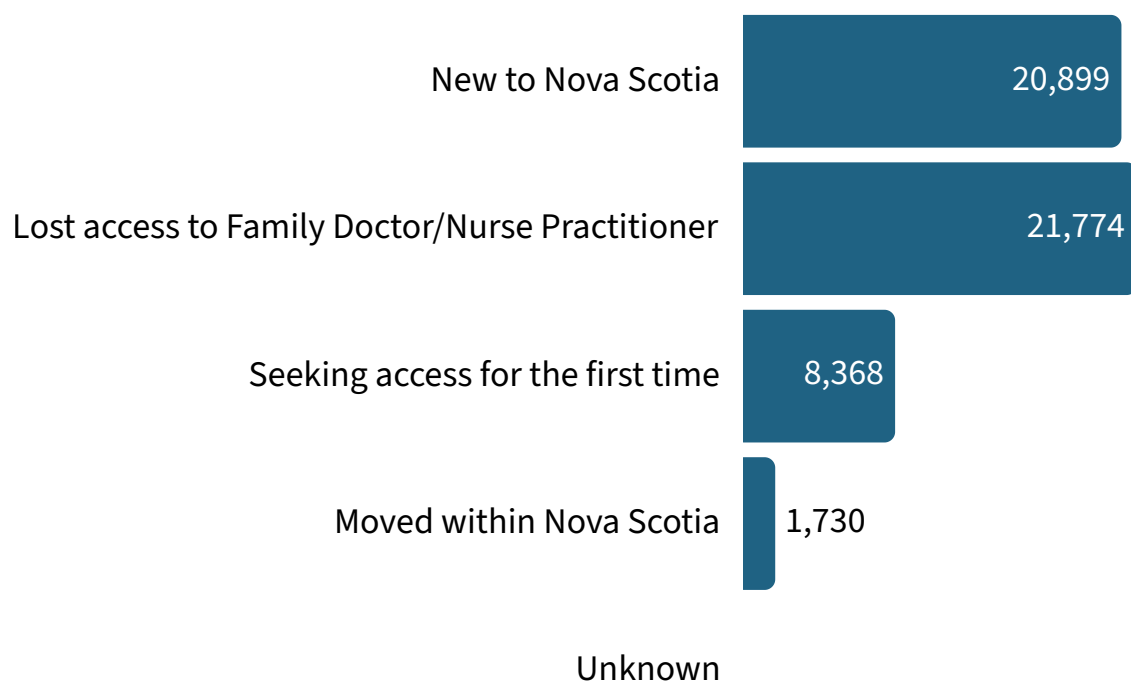

NEED A FAMILY PRACTICE REGISTRY: GLOSSARY

Active Registrants:

Registrants who are being actively supported to be attached to a family doctor or nurse practitioner.

New Registrants:

Persons who have newly joined the Need a Family Practice Registry via the request for registration process.

Returned Registrants:

When a person returns to active in the registry and requires further support to be attached to a family doctor or nurse practitioner.

Total Registry Entries:

The sum of all newly active registrants. This number includes both new registrants and returned registrants.

Attached Registrants:

When a person has been attached to a family doctor or nurse practitioner.

Resolved Registrants:

When a person no longer requires support to be attached.

Attached & Resolved:

The sum of all attached and resolved registrants.
