

Digby General Hospital

Digby General Hospital serves a population of approximately 20,000 people living in the Town of Digby, Municipality of Digby, the District of Clare and the villages of Freeport, Tiverton, Westport, Weymouth and Bear River which is also home to Bear River First Nation.

The medical unit has 20 beds, and there is also a 13-bed restorative care unit. Approximately 222 employees provide the following programs and services:
