One-Alpha® (Alfacalcidol) and Hemodialysis

What is One-Alpha® (alfacalcidol)?

- One-Alpha® is a medication with the active ingredient alfacalcidol. This is a form of vitamin D. The liver changes alfacalcidol to calcitriol, which is a form of vitamin D that can be used by the body.
- Alfacalcidol helps your body control your calcium and phosphate levels. Calcium and phosphate are needed to build healthy bone.
- It comes as a capsule (pill) or as a liquid.
 - With capsules, you will take a 0.25 mcg or 1 mcg dose (amount). With liquid, you will take a 2 mcg/ml dose.

Why does someone on hemodialysis need this medication?

- People get vitamin D from sunlight, and from eating oily fish and milk products. People with kidney disease cannot change enough vitamin D into calcitriol.
- This can cause:
 - low calcium levels in the blood.
 - > weaker bones.
- One-Alpha® raises the amount of vitamin D in your body that can be used.

How do I take One-Alpha®?

- Take this medication exactly as your primary health care provider (family doctor or nurse practitioner) tells you.
- Do not stop taking One-Alpha® before talking with your primary health care provider.
- If you forget to take a dose, take it as soon as you can. Do not double the dose if it is almost time for your next dose.

- This medication can:
 - be taken with water.
 - be swallowed without chewing.
 - be taken with or without food.

If your stomach feels upset after taking this medication, try taking it with food.

Are there any side effects?

- · Common side effects are:
 - Nausea (feeling sick to your stomach)
 - > Headaches
- Less common side effects are:
 - Constipation (not being able to poop)
 - Vomiting (throwing up)
 - Loss of appetite
 - > Peeing more than usual
 - Drowsiness (feeling tired or sleepy)
 - > Dry mouth
 - Muscle or bone pain
 - Irregular heartbeat
 - Red eyes

How do I store this medication?

- Store capsules:
 - > at room temperature (15 to 25 °C).
 - away from moisture and light. A bathroom medicine cabinet is a good place.
 - > out of reach of children and pets.
- Store liquid:
 - on a low shelf in the fridge (between 2 to 8 °C).
 - > away from sunlight.
 - out of reach of children and pets.
