



Vaccines in VaxRecordNS

- VaxRecordNS is a digital solution for people with a Nova Scotia Health Card to access their vaccine records. You must be at least 16 years old to use VaxRecordNS.
- With the exception of mpox, vaccinations received in Nova Scotia and reported to Public Health after 2008 will appear on your record in VaxRecordNS.

- VaxRecordNS contains vaccines from several sources including Public Health, primary care, and pharmacies. Records may take up to 12 weeks to load, and some records will not be available if they are not submitted to Public Health. If you need your record before it is loaded, or your record is not available after 12 weeks, you must contact the provider directly.
- In some cases, vaccine records prior to 2008 or those received out of province and reported to Nova Scotia Public Health may be available.
- *You may see "135" on your meningococcal quadrivalent immunization record. It is the same vaccine as the one listed on the provincial schedule.
