Vaccines in VaxRecordNS

- VaxRecordNS is a digital solution for people with a Nova Scotia Health Card to access their vaccine records*. You must be at least 16 years old to use VaxRecordNS.
- With the exception of MPox, vaccinations received in Nova Scotia and reported to Public Health after 2008** will appear on your record in VaxRecordNS.
