Those selected will have the following qualifications:

- Recent personal or family/caregiver experience with any NS Health healthcare service within the Cape Breton, Antigonish, or Guysborough areas.
- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Can look at issues from more than one point of view.
- Can share honest points of view in a respectful way.
- Be reflective of diverse populations and perspectives in our community.
- Interested in making a positive contribution to health care services.
- Previous volunteer experience is an asset.

Additional requirements:

- Sign a confidentiality agreement.
- Have or be willing to obtain a Criminal Background Check.
- Declare any potential conflicts of interest.
- Be able to commit to attend at least one (1) meeting per month. Meetings are typically held during daytime hours in hospital sites throughout NS Health, and virtually (online or by phone).
- Be able to devote several hours per month to preparing for meetings.
- Be able to commit to a term of two (2) years.

These are volunteer positions. Current NS Health employees, Foundation members, Community Health Board members and elected officials are not eligible to apply.
