Overview

- If you are not a Canadian resident with a valid health card, **you will be responsible for the cost of your care.**
- Nova Scotia Health charges fees for a variety of services based on a cost-recovery model. Fees are subject to change without notice. **You will also be charged a fee for accessing your health record. Fees vary.**
- Please note that fees are in Canadian funds and may be higher if special services, high-cost procedures, or drugs are used.

Emergency Health Services

Patients are responsible for all costs associated with ambulance services provided by Emergency Health Services.

Inpatient care

If you are admitted to hospital, you will be charged a daily rate. This standard rate includes your room and most services provided by the hospital and staff, including:

- › meals
- › most drugs and tests
- › blood work
- › X-rays

This rate does **NOT** include:

- › doctors' fees. You will be billed directly by the doctor.
- › telephone and TV services.
- › some high-cost drugs and tests.

We will try to give you the accommodations you request. But, private and semi-private rooms are not always available.

Lab – Other fluid (per test)	Up to \$102
General X-ray	Starting at \$137
CT scan	\$2,580
General ultrasound	Starting at \$231
MRI scan	\$2,459
Day surgery	\$4,842
PET	\$5,020

Fees are subject to change without notice.

Doctors' fees vary and are **NOT** included in these rates.



Insurance

- It is important that you understand what your private insurance does and does not cover.
- We recommend that you call your insurer to confirm the extent of your coverage. Due to privacy laws, hospital staff **cannot** do this for you. It is your responsibility to confirm your coverage.
- Insurers must provide a guarantee of payment before Nova Scotia Health will submit any claim.
- You must give full details of your insurance coverage to the hospital at the time you are admitted.
- You are responsible for payment of any amounts not paid by insurance, including cases where the insurer denies the claim. Payment may be made by cash, debit, cheque, Visa, Mastercard[®], or American Express[®] (select locations only).

IMPORTANT: Nova Scotia Health **does not** bill insurance companies directly for outpatient services. You are responsible for making arrangements to pay your bill for outpatient services before you leave the hospital. Exceptions may apply for international students with insurance through their institution.
