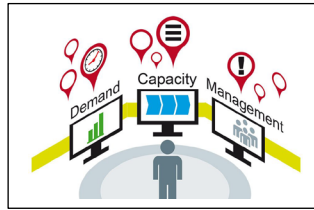


Volunteer Advisory Committee Member Integrated Access and Flow Network

The Access and Flow Network is a team, with strong representation from clinicians, patients and community members, scientific leads, data analytics support and innovation. - Be 18 years of age or older.
- Can look at issues from more than one point of view.
- Can share honest points of view in a respectful way.

- Previous volunteer experience is an asset.
- Interested in making a positive contribution to health care services.

Additional requirements:

- Sign a confidentiality agreement.
- Have or be willing to obtain a Criminal Background Check.
- Declare any potential conflicts of interest.
- Be available to attend daytime and/or evening meetings held virtually
- Be able to commit to attend 8–10 meetings annually. Meetings are typically held online via Microsoft teams during a weekday afternoon (3:30pm–5:00pm) monthly.
